



## Association of Ontario Snowboarders

This is a step by step outline to becoming a club member of The Association of Ontario Snowboarders - AOS (Provincial Sport Organization - PSO) and Canadian Snowboard Federation - CSF (National Sport Organization - NSO). As a member you are supporting the continuous development of the sport in Canada and receive support in developing competitive snowboarding within your club.

### STEP 1 – CLUB REGISTRATION

- Print and complete the **“Club Registration Form 2009-10”** available at <http://ontariosnowboarders.ca/registration.htm>
- Send form and annual fees to the AOS:
  - Mail, Fax, Scan/Email, or fill out in word and attach a copy of your electronic signature
  - Payment by cash or cheque is preferred (call us to pay by VISA)

### STEP 2 – ACTIVITY SANCTION

As a club member you receive free third party liability coverage for all snowboard related activity (a detailed description of coverage is available on request)

- Print and complete **“Activity Sanction Application Form 2009-10”**
- Activity Information: List of all snowboard related activity on and off the hill that your athletes will be participating in this season ie. Training (dry land and on-snow), all competitions, fundraisers, banquets etc. Please attach a detailed calendar or list that includes all the necessary details requested (see page 3 of the form “Activity Sanction Application Procedure” for instructions)
- A separate sanction application is required for each competition being hosted by your club in order to provide specific officials information for the event.

Note: If your teams are travelling to any competitions or trainings out of country there is a separate **“Out of Country Sanction Request”** form that must be completed for each trip

Applications for activity sanctions must be submitted at least two weeks prior to the start of the activity to allow time for processing.

### STEP 3 – ATHLETE REGISTRATION

All athletes in your club must be members of the AOS and CSF

Inlcuding:

- Entry level participants (RBC Riders/Interclub)
- Regional competitors (recreational/competitive)
- National level competitors
- FIS level competitors
- Seniors/masters

Please refer to **“Registration Fee Schedule 2009-10”**

Two-ways to register:

- a) To register a group of athletes fill out the **"AOS group membership"** spreadsheet. Please include all details. A total amount owing will appear at the bottom of the spreadsheet
- b) Athletes join and pay fees directly online at <http://www.ontariosnowboarders.ca/membership.htm>

Notes:

- High performance athletes who require a **FIS license/CAIP Insurance** must become AOS/CSF members first. Please indicate in the space provided whether a FIS license for this season is required. You must purchase licenses and insurance by logging into the CSF website, access will be activated within one week of receiving the current seasons membership application/fees. AOS/CSF memberships expire annually April 30
- **AOS general waiver** must be completed and collected from all athletes, prior to the start of any snowboard activity

#### STEP 4 –COACHES REGISTRATION

- **Coaches** must have CSCP training and a current coaches membership with CSF – membership dues are paid to the CSF directly and is outlined on their website at <http://www.csf.ca/en/coaching/license/>
- If you wish to send your staff for coaches training or would like to host a CSCP Basic Coach Workshop at your club please contact the AOS office to arrange
- **AOS general waiver** must be completed and collected from all coaches, prior to the start of any snowboard activity

#### VOLUNTEERS

- If you have parents who are interested in volunteering this season at your events or any other AOS sanctioned events we would welcome their support.
- Please share the attached **"AOS Needs Volunteers"** announcement with your athletes parents and other interested members and watch for more info on our upcoming officials training <http://www.ontariosnowboarders.ca/officials.htm>
- **AOS general waiver** must be completed and collected from all volunteers, prior to the start of any snowboard activity
- If you would like to **host a level 1 officials training** please contact the AOS office to arrange.
